Chatham County Community Service and Restitution for Youth

Service description: Community Service and Restitution provides opportunities for youth with court-ordered community service and/or restitution an organized program with accountability. The program offers work sites screened for youth. Staff have several pre-screened work sites available in the community and assign youth according to their age and ability. There are also group work days at sites such as Parks and Recreation maintained community centers and parks.

Court Referred Mediation

Service description: Court referred mediation is provided for people who are in court due to interpersonal conflict. A mediator, a third party neutral, conducts a private meeting with the disputants to give them the opportunity to work through their differences and come to an agreement on terms to settle their problem.

Eligibility: Any age person who has an appearance in district criminal court is eligible. The district attorney decides which cases are appropriate for mediation. People who are mentally impaired are generally unable to mediate successfully.

Advanced Directives: Health Care Power of Attorney & Living Will

Service description: Forms, witnesses, and notary are provided free of charge for this service. An advance directive is a set of directions you give about the health care you want if you ever lose the ability to make decisions for yourself. North Carolina has two ways for you to make a formal advance directive. One way is called a "living will," the other is called a "health care power of attorney." If you become unable to make your own decisions and do not have formal advance directives, your physician will consult someone close to you about your health care.

In North Carolina, a living will is a declaration that you desire to die a natural death. You do not want extraordinary medical treatment or artificial nutrition or hydration used to keep you alive if there is no reasonable hope of recovery. A living will gives your doctor permission to withhold or withdraw life support systems under certain conditions. You must sign the document in the presence of two witnesses, and it must be notarized.

In North Carolina, a health care power of attorney is a document that allows someone to make medical decisions for you if you cannot make them yourself. You may appoint any competent person who is at least 18 years old and who is not providing paid health care to you. The person you appoint is called your health care agent. You must sign the document in the presence of two witnesses, and it must be notarized.

Applications are usually taken in late October or early November; checks are issued in February based on the type of heating source, the household's income, and the area of the state the applicant lives in.

Energy Neighbor Energy and CEMC Project Share- This program is for households in a heating or cooling related emergency when service is provided by Energy Neighbor and Central Electric Membership Corporation. These programs have income limits and authorization is based on funding availability.

Garner Fuel Fund for the Elderly- A program run strictly on contributions from the community. These funds are used to provide heating or cooling for the elderly that are living on fixed incomes. The program is expanded, when contributions allow, to assist this same elderly group with prescriptions.
